JA Trades is a one-of-a-kind experience designed for 13 – 25 year old participants to see the value of jobs in trades. JA Trades will reach students in urban, suburban, and rural communities, in over 140 counties in Missouri and Illinois.

A mini municipality with 17 public and private enterprises includes retail shops, a bank, wellness center, TV and radio, and professional offices. This Town is a working free-enterprise community for up to 125 students daily. The program begins with a comprehensive classroom economics course for 4th through 6th grade students. After twelve lessons of preparation, the entire class travels to Junior Achievement's Dennis and Judy Jones Free Enterprise Center to operate the JA BizTown businesses.

Day at JA BizTown:

Students spend one entire day at the town applying lessons learned in the classroom to their jobs within JA BizTown. Volunteers and teachers, trained by JA prior to the visit, serve as consultants for the students. Students, assuming the roles of producer and consumer, manage their personal and business affairs to create a successful community. Two payroll cycles take place during the day's activities. Students can choose how to spend their income at retail businesses where they can purchase real products and services.

When filled with up to 125 students, JA BizTown takes on the feel of a small town. The experience empowers children to own personal responsibility and to work as a team to achieve common goals. JA BizTown also helps teachers by creating an exciting learning environment in which students are given opportunities to have tangible rather than imagined experiences, active rather than passive learning, and actual decision-making with consequences.

JA Finance Park & Career Center

Overview:

JA Finance Park is an economic education program for 7th through 12th grade students, where they are introduced to concepts centered around career exploration, personal finance and decision making. Following four weeks of classroom preparation, the entire class travels to Junior Achievement's Dennis and Judy Jones Free Enterprise Center which houses the JA Finance Park facility.

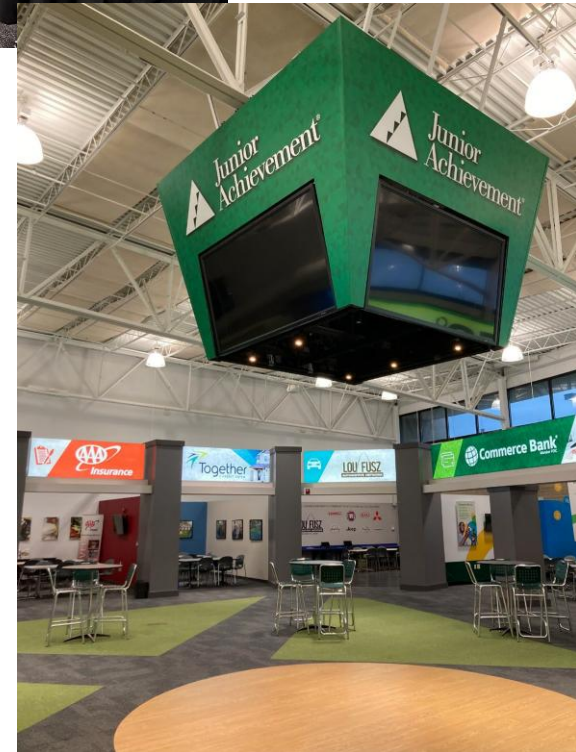
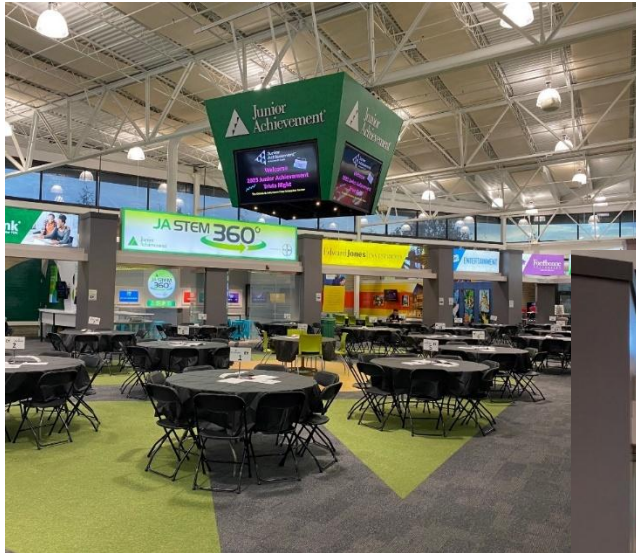
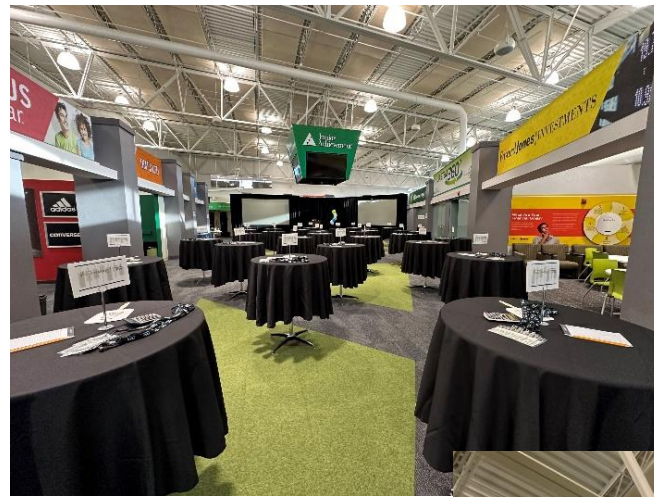
Day at JA Finance Park:

Each student is assigned a unique personal career and economic scenario that serves as the base of reference for making individual financial decisions. Career choices are drawn from the storefront businesses. Students will create a comprehensive monthly balanced budget based upon their job, monthly net income and family situation. Students accomplish all their work using tablet-based technology.

To accommodate the simulation, the facility is divided into separate business areas. Each business area deals with a piece of the students' comprehensive personal budget; exploring different expense categories within that business. They then create a budget, make purchasing decisions, and pay for their expenses.
